Greetings from inner-city Cleveland!

In our men's Bible study on Saturday mornings, we have been working through a book entitled <u>The 21 Most Dangerous Questions of the Bible</u>. Two weeks ago, we considered a question Mordecai asked Esther (recorded in Esther 4:14). Esther was between a rock and a hard place (to say the least), making her response either way a dangerous proposition. In encouraging her to advocate for her people, Mordecai inquired: "Yet who knows whether you have come to the kingdom for such at time as this?" His intent was to intimate (and celebrate!) the providence of God in placing Esther where she was as queen at a potentially defining moment in time and for a specific purpose. As we all know, the account goes on to describe how Esther's bold faith in the Lord was used to spare the Jewish people (her people) from the decree of death. It is truly amazing to realize that the same God who placed Esther in that critical position is still sovereignly placing people in His service today!

Emily is in eighth grade this year and is already busy with her schoolwork, volleyball practice and games (her team is 9 and 1!), piano lessons, and helping with the ministry in Cleveland. We know this school year will fly by (as they always seem to do). We are so thankful for the training that FBCS provides!
